

Presentation Options

Students may choose from the following creative formats to present their book. Each option encourages thoughtful reflection and imaginative expression. Include the **book title, author, main characters, setting, and key plot points** in presentation.

1. **Design a Game** Create a game inspired by your book—it can be a card game, board game, guessing game, or another original idea (no memory matching games, please).
 - Write clear, step-by-step instructions and rules
 - Teach the class how to play your game should reflect important elements of the story, including characters, setting, and plot.
2. **Make a Diorama** Build a 3D scene that recreates a setting or major event from the book.
 - Use a shoebox as the base
 - Include models of buildings, people, animals, or natural elements
 - Materials can include paper, photos, figurines, Styrofoam, twigs, shells, or pebbles. Accompany your diorama with a written description of the scene or an explanation of its significance in the story.
3. **Book in a Bag** This project encourages symbolic thinking and creativity.
 - Decorate a paper bag with the book's title, author, and a scene from the story
 - Place five to ten meaningful items inside the bag that represent key aspects of the book
 - During your presentation, explain the significance of each item
4. **Book Report Poster** Design a colorful, eye-catching poster that promotes your book like an advertisement.
 - Include the title, author, main characters, and setting
 - Make it neat and visually appealing—your poster will be displayed around the school. Your goal is to “sell” the book to your audience!
5. **Book Jacket Redesign** Reimagine the book's cover by designing a new front, back, and inside flap.
 - Include an original illustration
 - Write a summary of the book
 - Add an author bio and a few “reviews” or endorsements
6. **Book Trailer Video** Create a short movie-style trailer or slideshow with voice-over narration.
 - Include the title, author, and a summary
 - This option is available only to students who already have the skills to produce the video independently
7. **Comic Strip or Graphic Novel Page** Retell a key scene from the book in comic format.
 - Use illustrations and dialogue to bring the moment to life
 - Focus on clarity, creativity, and capturing the tone of the story
 - Should be colored and have the book title on it.
8. **Song or Poem Summary** Write and perform a song or poem that summarizes the book.
 - Highlight major themes, characters, and events
 - Perform it live or record it for your presentation

Directions: Please answer the following questions on lined paper using complete sentences. Reports should be handwritten*. Be sure to include your name and date.

1. Book title (be sure to underline it)
2. Author
3. What genre is your book from?
4. Who were the main characters? Give a brief description of each character.
5. Setting - Where and or when does the story take place? Write a 2 to 3 sentence description.
6. How does the story start and why do you think the author chose to start the book this way?
7. Describe your favorite or least favorite part of the story in 5 to 10 sentences.
8. What is the main conflict or problem in the story?
9. Did any of the characters in the book do something you did not like? Explain your answer.
10. Did you enjoy the book? Explain what was or was not enjoyable about the book.

* With the teacher's permission, students who find handwriting challenging may submit their reports in typed format

Reminder - Use complete sentences to answer all questions. Be sure to proof read your report before turning it in. Double check for spelling errors and make sure it is in your neatest handwriting.
